Good evening. Let the record reflect that the

time is 6:03P.M. My name is Claudia Rush. I am

25

employed with the Louisiana Department of

1 Environmental Quality, and I will be serving as  
2 Hearing Officer this evening, Thursday, March 6,  
3 2008.

4 This hearing is scheduled to accept public  
5 comments concerning a Proposed Part 70 Air permit  
6 renewal, an Acid Rain Air permit renewal, a  
7 Prevention of Significant Deterioration, or PSD,  
8 permit; a Clean Air Interstate Rule, or CAIR, permit;  
9 and the Associated Environmental Assessment Statement  
10 or EAS; for Southwestern Electric Power Company  
11 SWEPCO, American Electric Power, P.O. Box 660164,  
12 Dallas, Texas 75266-0164, for the Arsenal Hill Power  
13 Station/J. Lamar Stall Unit #1; Agency Interest No.  
14 1060, Permit Name Permit Number Activity Number  
15 Proposed Part 70 Air 0500-00008-V2 PER20070003  
16 Proposed Acid Rain Air 0500-00008-1V2 PER20070004 PSD  
17 PSD-LA-726 PER20070006 CAIR 0500-00008-IRO  
18 PER20080001.

19 The facility is located at 510 North Allen  
20 Avenue, Shreveport, Caddo Parish, Louisiana. SWEPCO  
21 requested a PSD permit for the installation and  
22 operation of the J. Lamar Stall Unit #1, a combined-  
23 cycle facility consisting of two combustion turbine  
24 generators (CTGs) with duct fired heat recovery steam  
25 generators (HSRGs) and associated ancillary

1 equipment. Each CTG will be rated at 180 MW,  
2 nominal. The CTGs and DBs will be fired exclusively  
3 with pipeline-quality natural gas.

4 The two CTG/HRSG trains will generate steam for  
5 the Steam Turbine Generator (STG) to produce  
6 electricity. Electricity produced by the STG and  
7 CTGs will be exported to the local power market.

8 The J. Lamar Stall Unit #1 facility will be  
9 located next to SWEPCO's existing Arsenal Hill Power  
10 Station. The J. Lamar Stall Unit #1 facility will be  
11 permitted with the Arsenal Power Station in the Part  
12 70 permit renewal, Acid Rain permit renewal, and the  
13 CAIR permit. These proposed permits were processed  
14 as expedited permits in accordance with  
15 LAC33:I.Chapter 18.

16 Arkansas' Caney Creek Wilderness Area, the  
17 nearest Class I area, is over 207 kilometers from the  
18 site, precluding any significant impact. The federal  
19 land manager of the Caney Creek Wilderness Area has  
20 examined the emissions increases from the  
21 installation and operation of the J. Lamar Stall Unit  
22 #1 facility and determined that there will be no  
23 adverse impacts to the Class I area.

24 The EAS submitted by the applicant addresses  
25 avoidance of potential and real environmental

1 effects, balancing of social and economic benefits  
2 against environmental impact costs, and alternative  
3 sites, projects, and mitigative measures.

4 This Hearing is not being conducted in a  
5 question and answer format. Please remember that the  
6 purpose of this public hearing is for LDEQ to receive  
7 your comments concerning the Proposed Permits and the  
8 Associated EAS.

9 This Hearing is to provide all individuals a  
10 chance to be heard regardless of their position on  
11 the Proposed Permits and the Associated EAS.

12 Courteous behavior is expected of everyone at  
13 all times. You may speak in support of, or in  
14 opposition to, the Proposed Permits; or simply to  
15 provide additional information. All interested  
16 persons will be given a reasonable opportunity to  
17 comment, unless testimony is not related to the  
18 purpose of the hearing. Your comments will be  
19 evaluated and addressed in the Department's written  
20 response.

21 A public notice advertising this Public Hearing  
22 and Request for Public Comment on these Proposed  
23 Permits and the Associated EAS was published on  
24 Friday, February 1, 2008 in The Times, Shreveport,  
25 Louisiana, and also in The Advocate, in Baton Rouge,

1 Louisiana.

2 Copies of the material associated with these  
3 Proposed Permits and the Associated EAS are available  
4 for inspection and review at the LDEQ, Public Records  
5 Center, Room 127, 602 North 5th Street, Baton Rouge,  
6 Louisiana. Viewing hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.,  
7 Monday through Friday, except holidays.

8 Additional, copies are available for review at  
9 the Shreve Memorial Library, which Headquarters are  
10 424 Texas Street, Shreveport, LA.

11 The available information can also be accessed  
12 electronically on the Electronic Document Management  
13 System (EDMS) on the DEQ public website at  
14 [www.deq.Louisiana.gov](http://www.deq.Louisiana.gov).

15 In addition, copies of the Public Notice  
16 announcing this Public Hearing were mailed on  
17 Thursday, January 31, 2008, via the US Postal Service  
18 and via e-mail, to individuals who have requested to  
19 be placed on the mailing list maintained by the LDEQ,  
20 Office of Environmental Services.

21 In accordance with Louisiana Administrative  
22 Code, Title 33, Part III, Section 531.A.3.c, comments  
23 received by 12:30 p.m., Monday, March 10, 2008, will  
24 be considered prior to a final decision. All  
25 comments received by 12:30 p.m., Monday, March 10,

1       2008, shall be retained by the Department and  
2       considered in determining whether to issue or deny  
3       the Proposed Permits. Written comments on the  
4       Proposed Permit may be submitted to Ms. Soumaya  
5       Ghosn, LDEQ-OES, Environmental Assistance  
6       Division, P.O. Box 4313, Baton Rouge, LA 70821-4313.

7             Under Louisiana Revised Statutes 30:2017, as  
8       revised by the legislature in the 2004 session, the  
9       Department is required to follow the following order  
10      of speakers, with the provision that the Presiding  
11      Officer may give preference to a public official to  
12      speak at any time during the hearing. However, any  
13      time limit set for citizen testimony shall apply to  
14      public officials.

15            The Department must provide up to 30 minutes to  
16      the permit applicant for an introductory  
17      presentation. Thereafter, preference for speaking up  
18      to one hour is given as follows:

19            For the first hour, to those citizens who live  
20      within a two-mile radius of the location of the  
21      facility;

22            For the second hour, to those citizens who work  
23      within a two-mile radius of the location of the  
24      facility;

25            And for the third hour, to those citizens who

1 live within the parish of the location of the  
2 facility.

3 Thereafter, each hour of the hearing shall  
4 alternate between those who are in support of the  
5 Proposed Permit and those who are opposed to it.

6 The order of speakers for tonight's hearing will  
7 be based on the information provided by the speaker  
8 on the registration form. Anyone who registered to  
9 speak but did not provide the necessary information  
10 will be given the opportunity to speak; however, they  
11 will be called last in the order of registration.

12 This Hearing is being transcribed; therefore,  
13 each speaker should begin his or her comments by  
14 stating, for the record, their name, address, and any  
15 organization he or she may represent.

16 I also remind you to please turn off, or  
17 silence, all cell phones and other electronic devices  
18 at this time. Thank you.

19 At this time, the permit applicant's  
20 representative, well let's see, may come forward and  
21 make their introductory presentation. Thank you.

22 I will now begin by allowing all persons who  
23 have signed up to speak five minutes, in which, to  
24 present their comments.

25 Anyone who needs more than five minutes will be

1 allowed to complete his/her comments after all the  
2 registered speakers have had the opportunity to  
3 speak.

4 The first to speak will be those citizens who  
5 live within a two-mile radius of the location of the  
6 facility.

7 The next group of speakers will be those who  
8 work within a two-mile radius of the location of the  
9 facility.

10 Next are those citizens who live within the  
11 parish of the location of the facility.

12 At this time I call on those citizens who are in  
13 support of the Proposed Permits, followed by those  
14 citizens who are opposed. After all speakers who  
15 have signed up to speak are finished, the hearing  
16 officer may request that anyone else who would like  
17 the opportunity to speak should please come forward  
18 and do so at this time.

19 SPEAKERS

20 MR. HENRY L. BURNS:

21 Hello, my name is Henry Burns. I live at 134  
22 Chimney Lane in Haughton Louisiana 71037. I was  
23 recently elected to District 9 House of  
24 Representatives. The reason that I came was to see  
25 the process and the dynamics. I serve on

1       Agricultural Natural Resources Committee and just  
2       wanted to see the dynamics involved so incase I am  
3       invited to another one I can attend one.

4               So really truly it's just fact-finding and I  
5       am just pleased to be here. And thank you for your  
6       attention because this gives the public a chance to  
7       express themselves both pro and con. And obviously  
8       energy is a key issue in our country. And by the  
9       fact that you are giving the public the chance to  
10      express either the positive and negative I think is  
11      very good. So I really just wanted to come.

12              I don't really qualify as a speaker because I am  
13      not talking for or against. I am really here in a  
14      fact-finding mode just to see the process. But I do  
15      appreciate the opportunity and thank you for your  
16      service to our state.

17                      CHAIRPERSON: Okay. Thank you. The  
18      next speaker is Mr. B.L. Buddy Shaw.

19      MR. B.L. BUDDY SHAW:

20              I am Senator B.L. "Buddy" Shaw, District 37 this  
21      is a filibuster. No really the previous speaker was  
22      the filibuster but I like him. I was anticipating  
23      the gathering of thousands. In fact I even brought a  
24      consultant with me who is an expert in the field and  
25      could explain to me all the technical terms. However

1 hearing the previous speaker did not have a  
2 vocabulary equipped for technical terms it appears to  
3 me that all has now been satisfied. I am a member of  
4 the Environmental Quality in the Senate of the  
5 Louisiana State Legislature. So I thought I would  
6 come out here. I do have a question if I may ask it.

7 CHAIRPERSON: You may ask it, I may  
8 not be able to answer it and probably shouldn't.

9 MR. SHAW: Well it maybe redundant,  
10 but the point is we don't have a permit writer here  
11 tonight is that correct?

12 CHAIRPERSON: No, I don't believe we  
13 have one here tonight.

14 MR. SHAW: Who can speak in his  
15 behalf?

16 CHAIRPERSON: Well you have to submit  
17 your question as a comment and we should be able to  
18 answer that way.

19 MR. SHAW: Okay. The comment is, is  
20 everybody happy with this decision so far?

21 CHAIRPERSON: Well?

22 MR. SHAW: Everybody out there in the  
23 audience happy? We feel it is safe and  
24 environmentally appropriate? Well, not getting much  
25 of a response I will accept that as a yes. Folks


