

PROCEDURES WHEN FAILING THE LOUISIANA VEHICLE EMISSIONS INSPECTION

NOTE

- **BEFORE PROCEEDING WITH ANY OF THE OPTIONS LISTED BELOW, YOU MAY CONTACT THE CHALLENGE STATION FOR A FREE RETEST TO VERIFY RESULTS OF THE INITIAL EMISSIONS INSPECTION.**
- One retest is free at the original MVI station within 30 days of issuance of rejection sticker.

• IF A VEHICLE FAILS FOR TROUBLE CODES

Have vehicle repaired.

Return to the original MVI station for a retest with a properly completed repair form.

• IF A VEHICLE FAILS FOR OVERALL READINESS

Two weeks of normal driving will generally correct the problem, but performing a specific drive cycle may also be effective.

Drive cycles may be obtained by contacting a dealership, a certified mechanic, LDEQ or the Challenge Station, and are also available on the Internet.

Vehicles that continue to fail for readiness may need repair.

Return to the original MVI station with a properly completed repair form to receive a retest.

• IF A VEHICLE FAILS FOR COMMUNICATION

Have vehicle repaired, if necessary.

Present VIR, completed repair form, and the vehicle for retest at either the Challenge Station or the original MVI station.

A motorist whose vehicle passes at the Challenge Station will be instructed to return to the original MVI station to receive a valid inspection sticker.
