A Notice of Intent concerning the above referenced proposed Rules was published on November 20, 2006 in the *Louisiana Register* (See LR 32:2125-2133), relative to

collaborative drug therapy management between physicians and pharmacists (CDTM). Written comments were invited, received and considered. Certain of those comments suggested substantive changes for sake of consistency with similar proposed Rules noticed by the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy (LBP) (See LR 32:2133-2139). In consideration of such comments the board proposes to amend certain portions of the proposed Rules to more closely parallel those of the LBP by expanding the diseases or conditions subject to CDTM to include dyslipidemia and to rearrange the order of diseases and conditions subject to CDTM to reflect this addition (§7403, Definition of Disease Specific Drug Therapy); and by deleting the prohibition against the use of CDTM for research, clinical or investigational trials, as well as for drugs not identified by the manufacturer for the treatment of a disease or condition subject to CDTM [§7423(F)(6), (10)] and to rearrange the order of items not subject to CDTM to reflect these deletions. Accordingly, the board proposes to amend the proposed Sections as follows.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the draft revision to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for the Lake Charles Area, Calcasieu Parish, Section 110(a)(1) Maintenance Plan. We have reviewed the draft SIP revision in relation to the May 20, 2005, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) maintenance plan guidance. We find the SIP revision to be well organized and consistent with this guidance.

Our comments on this draft SIP revision are as follows:

1. When EPA designated areas national-wide and promulgated the Louisiana table of designated areas for the 8-hour ozone standard (69 FR 23907, April 30, 2004), one of Louisiana's designated areas is the Lake Charles area that includes Calcasieu Parish. In order to be consistent with identification of the designated 8-hour ozone area, please add "Lake Charles Area" throughout the text as appropriate where references are made to Calcasieu Parish, including the plan title, associated text, and cover letter.
2. In section 5.1, the second paragraph, the 2003-2005 1-hour ozone design values should be reported in units of ppb, so that it reads: "The design value for Carlyss was 113 ppb; Westlake at 98 ppb; and Vinton at 106 ppb".
3. On page 14, the sentence at the top of the page needs to include the following information: ". . . the area has monitored attainment for the latest six complete three-year periods for Carlyss and Westlake, and has monitored attainment for the latest four complete three-year period for Vinton."
4. In Tables 5-1 through 5-3, the following language should be added to the column titled "# of days": "> 84 ppb".

5. In Section 7.2 - Contingency Measures, the list includes three measures but does not clearly specify them. The list of contingency measures should clearly specify the controls which will be considered for adoption. For instance, one of the listed measures is "Additional VOC emission control regulations" rather than "Revision of VOC emission control regulations in LAC 33:III.Chapter 21, to increase stringency" that has been a listed measure in other parishes' contingency measures. Other parishes' contingency measures also have included a fourth control measure: emission offsets for permits (1.10 to 1.0 ratio for VOC and NOx).

As we have discussed with the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ) staff, the D.C. Circuit Court did rule on EPA's phase 1 ozone regulation on December 22, 2006. EPA responded to the Court on March 22, 2007, by asking for clarification and rehearing. In the meantime, we encourage LDEQ to continue its efforts toward adopting this Section 110(a)(1) maintenance plan by June 15, 2007.

The Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association appreciates the opportunity to comment on the Calcasieu Parish Ozone Maintenance Plan which appeared as a Potpourri notice (0703Pot1) in the March 20, 2007 Louisiana Register. Mid-Continent is an industry trade association representing individuals and companies who together produce, transport, refine and market crude oil, natural gas, petroleum products and electricity in Louisiana. Mid-Continent represents several companies that have operations in Calcasieu Parish including three refineries.

#### **Comment 1 – Section 4 – Maintenance Demonstration**

Mid-Continent suggests the Department also acknowledge the significant emission reductions that will occur due to the consent decrees for the ConocoPhillips and CITGO refineries under EPA's Petroleum Refinery Initiative. When completed, these reductions will further assure that the area remains in compliance with the ozone standard.

#### **Comment 2 – Section 7 – Contingency Plan**

Mid-Continent requests the discussion of the "triggering event" date be clarified. Of primary concern is a possible misinterpretation that a single daily "exceedance" of the standard would be considered a "violation." Additionally it is not clear whether the 24 month clock begins during the year when the triggering event occurs or at the end of the year when the three-year period is completed and the data is quality checked.

Once again, Mid-Continent appreciates the opportunity to submit these comments.

## Comment Summary Calcasieu Parish Maintenance Plan

**Comment:** Designated 8-hour ozone area: On April 30, 2004, EPA designated areas for the 8-hour ozone standard. These designations included an area designated as the Lake Charles area; this area includes Calcasieu Parish. Please refer to the area as designated and replace all reference to Calcasieu Parish as the maintenance area.

**Response:** EPA is correct that the designated area is listed as the Lake Charles Area in 40 CFR 81.319. However, all Federal Register notices pertaining to original SIP submittals from this area reference Calcasieu Parish. In order to maintain continuity within the Federal Register and the LDEQ filing system, the state elects to use Calcasieu Parish as the reference for the maintenance area.

**Comment:** Section 5.1 Attainment of the 1-Hour Ozone Standard: Design values should be reported in units of ppb (parts per billion) instead of ppm (parts per million)

**Response:** The correction has been made and all units are now reported as ppb.

**Comment:** Section 5.2 – Attainment of the 8-hour Ozone Standard: Inclusion of information detailing the data presented in Tables 5-1, 5-2 and 5-3.

**Response:** The data has been clarified for the latest three-year periods.

**Comment:** Section 5.2 – Attainment of the 8-hour Ozone Standard: Language to be added to 6<sup>th</sup> column, which is titled “# of days”.

**Response:** “> 84 ppb” has been added to the column heading.

**Comment:** Section 7.2 Contingency Measures: The list of contingency measures should clearly specify the controls which will be considered for adoption.

**Response:** The section regarding contingency measures has been edited to include those controls which were listed in earlier maintenance plans as requested.

**Comment:** Section 4: Maintenance Demonstration: Commenter suggests that the LDEQ acknowledge certain industries for the “significant emission reductions” and their assurance that the area will remain in attainment.

**Response:** LDEQ acknowledges these emission reductions and appreciates all of the effort industry has put forth in this effort.

**Comment:** Section 7 Contingency Measures: Commenter requests “triggering event” be clarified.

**Response:** As written, a triggering event is a violation of the 8-hour ozone standard. A violation occurs when the average of the 4<sup>th</sup> highest 8-hour ozone reading within a three-year period is greater than 84 ppb. The 24 month period suggested by EPA guidance will begin to run as soon as the LDEQ has performed an analysis of the data and has determined that a violation did occur.
