Improving compliance at construction sites is one of the EPA's national enforcement priorities. Construction projects have a high potential for environmental harm because they disturb large areas of land and significantly increase the potential for erosion. Without on site pollution controls, sediment-laden run-off from construction sites can flow directly to the nearest waterway and degrade water quality.
