2 **MR. SMITH:**

3 Good evening. Let the record
4 reflect that the time is 6:02 p.m. My
5 name is O.C. Smith, III. I am employed
6 with the Louisiana Department of
7 Environmental Quality. I will be
8 serving as the hearing officer this
9 evening, Thursday January 18, 2007.

10 This hearing is scheduled to
11 accept public comments concerning a
12 Proposed Part 70 Air Operating Permit
13 Modification, a Proposed Prevention of
14 Significant Deterioration (PSD) Permit
15 Modification, and a Proposed Acid Rain
16 Permit Modification and the Associated
17 Environmental Assessment Statement
18 (EAS), hereafter referred to as the
19 Proposed Part 70 Air, PSD and Acid Rain
20 Permit Modifications and the Associated
21 EAS or the Proposed Permit Modifications
22 and the Associated EAS for Louisiana
23 Generating, LLC, Big Cajun II Unit four,
24 211 Telly Street, New Roads, Louisiana
25 70760. Agency Interest Number 38867,

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1 Permit Numbers 2260-00012-V1, PSD-LA-677
2 (M-1) and 2260-00012-IV3 and
3 corresponding Activity Tracking Numbers
4 PER20060002, PER20060003 and
5 PER20060004. The facility is located at
6 9951 Cajun 2 Road (Hwy 981) near New
7 Roads, Pointe Coupee Parish, Louisiana.

8 Louisiana Generation, LLC,
9 proposes to expand Big Cajun II Power
10 Plant by constructing and operating a
11 new pulverized coal boiler, Boiler
12 number 4(2B2) -- excuse me, (2B4), that
13 will be capable of using both low-
14 sulfur, Powder River Basin (PRB), sub-
15 bituminous coal and high sulfur
16 bituminous coal as fuel. Additional
17 material handling capabilities,
18 including fuel delivery, fuel
19 conveyance, ash handling, limestone
20 handling and gypsum handling facilities
21 will also be installed as part of these
22 modifications.

23 The EAS submitted by the applicant
24 addresses avoidance of potential and
25 real environmental effects, balancing of

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social and economic benefits against environmental impact costs and alternative sites, projects, and mitigative measures.

The Hearing is not being conducted in a question and answer format. Please remember that the purpose of this public hearing is for DEQ to receive your comments concerning the Proposed Part 70 Air, PSD, and Acid Rain Permit Modifications and the Associated EAS.

This hearing is to provide all individuals a chance to be heard regardless of their position on the Proposed Permit Modifications and the Associated EAS.

Courteous behavior is expected of everyone at all times. You may speak in support of, in opposition to, the Proposed Permit Modifications and the Associated EAS; or simply to provide additional information. All interested persons will be given a reasonable opportunity to comment, unless testimony is not related to the purpose of the

1 hearing. Your comments will be
2 evaluated and addressed in the
3 Department's written response.

4 A Public Notice advertising this
5 public hearing and request for public
6 comment on the Proposed Part 70 Air,
7 PSD, and Acid Rain Permit Modifications
8 and the Associated EAS was published on
9 the Thursday, December 14, 2006 in The
10 Pointe Coupee Banner, New Roads,
11 Louisiana and also in The Advocate,
12 Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

13 A copy of the material associated
14 with the Proposed Permit Modifications
15 and the Associated EAS is available for
16 inspection and review at the LDEQ,
17 Public Records Center, Room 127, 602
18 North 5th Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana.
19 Viewing hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30
20 p.m., Monday through Friday except
21 holidays.

22 The available information can also
23 be accessed electronically on the
24 Electronic Document Management System
25 (EDMS) on the DEQ public website at

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1 www.deq.louisiana.gov.

2 An additional copy is available
3 for review at the Pointe Coupee Parish
4 Library, 201 Claiborne Street, New
5 Roads, Louisiana 70760-3403.

6 In addition, on December 11, 2006,
7 copies of the Public Notice announcing
8 this Public Hearing were mailed to
9 individuals who have requested to be
10 placed on the mailing list maintained by
11 the Office of Environmental Services.

12 In accordance with Louisiana
13 Administrative Code, Title 33, Part III,
14 Section 531A.3.c, comments received by
15 12:30 p.m., Monday, January 22, 2007,
16 will be considered prior to a final
17 decision. All comments received by
18 12:30 p.m., Monday, January 22, 2007
19 shall be retained by the Department and
20 considered in determining whether to
21 issue or deny the Proposed Permit
22 Modifications.

23 Written comments on the Proposed
24 Permit Modifications and the Associated
25 EAS may be submitted to Ms. Soumaya, S-

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1 O-U-M-A-Y-A, Ghosn, G-H-O-S-N, LDEQ-OES,
2 Environmental Assistance Division, P.O.
3 Box 4313, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 70821-
4 4313.

5 Under Louisiana Revised Statutes
6 Title 30 Section, 2017, as revised by
7 the legislature in the 2004 session, the
8 Department is required to follow the
9 following order with the provision that
10 the presiding officer may give
11 preference to a public official to speak
12 at any time during the hearing.
13 However, any time limit set for citizen
14 testimony shall apply to public
15 officials.

16 The Department must provide up to
17 30 minutes to the permit applicant for
18 an introductory presentation.
19 Thereafter, preference for speaking up
20 to one hour is given as follows:

21 For the first hour, to those
22 citizens who live within a two-mile
23 radius of the location of the facility;
24 for the second hour, to those citizens
25 who work within a two-mile radius of the

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1 location of the facility; and for the
2 third hour, to those citizens who live
3 within the parish of the location of the
4 facility.

5 Thereafter, each hour of the
6 hearing shall alternate between those
7 who are in support of and those who are
8 opposed to, the Proposed Permit
9 Modifications and the Associated EAS.

10 The order of speakers for
11 tonight's hearing will be based on the
12 information provided by the speaker on
13 the registration form. Anyone who
14 registered to speak but did not provide
15 the necessary information will be given
16 the opportunity to speak; however, they
17 will be called last in the order of
18 registration.

19 This hearing is being transcribed;
20 therefore, I ask that each speaker begin
21 by stating for the record their name,
22 address and any organization he or she
23 may represent. I also remind you to
24 please turn off all cell phones. Thank
25 you.

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1 At this time, the permit
2 applicant's representative may come
3 forward and make their introductory
4 presentation. Mr. Jeff Baudier.

5 **MR. BAUDIER:**

6 Good evening. Thank you, Mr.
7 Smith, and all of those of you who
8 braved this weather tonight to come out
9 and listen to us speak in support of
10 this project. My name is Jeff Baudier
11 and I'm the Regional President for
12 Entergy Inc., here in Louisiana. And
13 we're here tonight regarding the
14 modification of our air permit, what we
15 call the Big Cajun II Unit Four project.
16 Big Cajun II facility which is well
17 known in the community currently
18 consists of three coal units with
19 approximately 1,730 megawatts of
20 electrical generating capacity that went
21 operational in 1981. These facilities
22 currently serve eleven electric district
23 distribution cooperatives in Louisiana
24 providing 100 percent of the power for
25 their customers. They exist in 58

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1 parishes and we serve through those co-
2 ops approximately 350,000 households in
3 Louisiana. What we're proposing to do
4 is add a fourth unit at the Big Cajun II
5 unit facility. This is proposed to be a
6 705 mega-watt capacity unit which would
7 have the equivalent capacity of
8 supplying approximately 705,000 homes.
9 The unit will cost 1.3 billion dollars
10 to build over a four year period and of
11 that amount over 200 million will be
12 spent to implement pollution control
13 equipment on the facility. The result
14 would be a pulverized coal burning unit
15 capable of providing low cost stable
16 electric generation to the region and an
17 affordable alternative to high priced
18 natural gas powered electricity. The
19 unit, most importantly, we use best
20 available control technology to reduce
21 air emissions. It includes selective
22 catalytic reduction which controls NOx.
23 Bag house to control particulate and
24 mercury emissions and scrubbers to
25 remove sulfur dioxide.

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1 A community and economic benefit
2 study was performed by Dr. James
3 Richardson from the Economics Department
4 at Louisiana State University. His
5 study concludes the this project will
6 bring approximately 1,000 construction
7 jobs to the area over the four year
8 construction period. It will result in
9 approximately 30 to 40 permanent jobs in
10 Pointe Coupee Parish. The operation of
11 the plant will increase business
12 activity in the state by 212 million
13 annually and household earnings by 48
14 million annually. The taxes, the state
15 and local government will be
16 approximately 7.1 million as a result of
17 economic activity during this four year
18 construction period.

19 Now, why we're here tonight is
20 simply for a modification of the
21 existing air permit that was already
22 issued in August of 2005 for this
23 facility. The reason for the
24 modification was because the existing
25 facility was designed to burn Wyoming

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1 coal which was a very specific narrowly
2 classified coal with certain
3 characteristics. The price of Wyoming
4 coal had spiked recently in past years.
5 And so what we did was decide to add
6 additional modifications to the back end
7 environmental controls on these plants,
8 specifically including the addition of
9 wet scrubbers which have the ability to
10 reduce or to remove 98 percent of sulfur
11 dioxide emissions. And what this allows
12 us to do is burn a variety of coals
13 other than the narrow Wyoming coal.
14 This will, in effect, allow us to
15 produce the same amount of energy and
16 allow us to have no significant impact
17 on the emissions from the plant, from
18 the exiting permit. And so as a result
19 it will generate much better economics
20 for the plant and the resulting
21 electricity produced for the end user.

22 So once again we appreciate the
23 opportunity to come here and talk about
24 this project. We very much appreciate
25 all those members of the community who

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came out here to listen to this and provide their own comments. And we also appreciate all the efforts of the DEQ and Mr. Smith and his team who have assisted us with this permit. Thank you very much.

MR. SMITH:

Thank you. I'll begin now by allowing all persons who have signed up to speak, and we'll go with five minutes to present your comments. Anyone who needs more than five minutes will be allowed to finish his or her comments after all the registered speakers have had the opportunity to speak once. And we have Senator Marionneaux.

MR. MARIONNEAUX:

Good afternoon. Robert Marionneaux on behalf of the citizens of Pointe Coupee, State Senate District 17, 2993 Louisiana Highway 78, Livonia, Louisiana. Mr. Smith and the Department, we first thank you for your work and your efforts of this permitting process. To those at Louisiana

1 Generating we thank you for the work
2 that you've done thus far and we look
3 forward to a lasting relationship with
4 you here in Pointe Coupee Parish. As it
5 relates to the existing permit that is
6 being applied for by Louisiana
7 Generating let me first say that I'm
8 happy to support the application and the
9 permit application. For several reasons
10 this region has been part of a non-
11 attainment status with regard to our air
12 quality. I'm happy to know that as a
13 result of the new permit that's being
14 sought by Louisiana Generating we will
15 not exacerbate the problem of the bad
16 air that we have in this region. So for
17 that reason first and foremost I'm happy
18 to support the application. Secondly
19 I'm happy to have Louisiana Generating
20 continue to build what they have here
21 within the parish in hopes that we
22 continue to grow with the power that's
23 spread across Louisiana. I think as you
24 said 58 parishes presently receive power
25 in Louisiana and it's certainly a good

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1 thing that we're able to sustain 350,000
2 households to date upwards of 700,000
3 once the project is completed. The more
4 that we can do for ourselves in
5 Louisiana the less we have to rely on
6 foreign sources of power and energy, the
7 better off we are. In particularly the
8 more better off we are as a result of
9 the -- not increasing the danger to our
10 citizens, in particular, the air quality
11 in this region. We all know the ripple
12 effect that can come from a non-
13 attainment status within these five
14 parishes and anything, particularly an
15 expansion of a project which can
16 generate revenue, hire local people, aid
17 the economy and does not lend itself in
18 a harmful way to the environment we
19 certainly ought to support those types
20 of endeavors. And the information I
21 received is that this such a project and
22 for that reason I'm happy to support it.
23 Thank you all for allowing me to make
24 those comments.

25 **MR. SMITH:**

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1 Thank you. The next group of
2 citizens permitted to speak will be
3 those who live within a two mile radius
4 of the location of the facility. And I
5 have none that have indicated that on
6 their sign in sheets. And so the next
7 preference is those speakers who work
8 within a two mile radius of the location
9 of the facility. And Ms. Melanie Bueche
10 is next on the list.

11 **MS. BUECHE:**

12 My name is Melanie Bueche and I
13 live in Lakeland, Louisiana on Highway
14 416 here in Pointe Coupee Parish.
15 Presently I'm a member of the Pointe
16 Coupee Parish Police Jury and I serve as
17 its President. I come before you this
18 evening to speak in favor of Louisiana
19 Generating's permit to request to have
20 the option on what type of fuels they
21 use in their operation. Louisiana
22 Generating's impact on our parish has
23 been absolutely tremendous. It has
24 provided jobs with outstanding benefits
25 to our citizens and ad valorem tax money

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1 for our governing entities to function.
2 We the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury
3 support Louisiana Generating's ambitious
4 plan 100 percent. Thank you.

5 **MR. SMITH:**

6 Thanks you. Our next registered
7 speaker is Frances Bartee.

8 **MS. BARTEE:**

9 Thank you for giving me the
10 opportunity to speak. My name is
11 Frances Bartee and I am President of the
12 Greater Pointe Coupee Chamber of
13 Commerce. I live at 315 Fairfield
14 Subdivision. And I can only reiterate
15 what Senator Marionneaux and Ms. Bueche
16 have said. Of course this company is
17 kind of near and dear, before it became
18 Louisiana Generating my husband retired
19 from there. But on behalf of the Board
20 of Chamber of Commerce we do want to let
21 the people and you know that the Chamber
22 of Commerce does support Louisiana
23 Generating and your efforts. Thank you.

24 **MR. SMITH:**

25 Our next registered speaker is

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1 Jeanne Hendrix.

2 **MS. HENDRIX:**

3 Hello, my name is Jeanne Hendrix.
4 I live at 101 Mill Street here in
5 Louisiana. I'm here representing
6 Representative Don Cazayoux and I just
7 have a short statement that I've
8 prepared. At the following meeting in
9 May 2005 Representative Cazayoux spoke
10 in favor of the plan Big Cajun II Unit
11 Four expansion project in New Roads.
12 I'm pleased to convey his continued
13 support of this project. If approved
14 the modified permit would allow for the
15 use of those eastern and western coal
16 facility with little or no environmental
17 impact. The expansion will serve as
18 significant economic stimulus with an
19 estimated 1100 jobs during construction.
20 Big Cajun has been a vital asset to the
21 community and its 25 years of operation.
22 Representative Cazayoux continues to
23 pledge his support in this expansion and
24 respectfully request the permit's
25 approval. Thank you.

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1 **MR. SMITH:**

2 Thank you. At this time we have
3 heard from everyone who has registered
4 to speak. I want to make sure does
5 anyone else wish to make comments for
6 the record. I see none. I have 22
7 minutes past the hour of six. And what
8 we're doing to do is we're going to
9 recess this hearing until seven p.m. to
10 make sure that we get anybody who comes
11 in late. And we'll close the hearing at
12 this point unless someone comes and
13 wishes to speak. So we stand in recess.

14 **(OFF THE RECORD)**

15 **MR. SMITH:**

16 I have now seven p.m., no
17 additional speakers have come to
18 register. Is anyone here wish to speak
19 for the record? No one? No one. No
20 one.

21 I remind you that the comment
22 period for the Proposed Part 70 Air,
23 PSD, and Acid Rain Permit Modifications
24 and the Associated EAS for the Louisiana
25 Generating, LLC, ends at 12:30 p.m.

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1 Monday January 22, 2007. I have
2 received no exhibits for the record
3 during this hearing. If there are no
4 other comments, I thank you for you
5 attention and participation in this
6 hearing. Let the record reflect the
7 time is now 7:01 p.m. This hearing is
8 closed.

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
