Enviroschool for communities continues in February 2009

BATON ROUGE – Enviroschool is a training session presented by the Department of Environmental Quality that helps the public better understand the agency and how it operates. In February, the topic for Baton Rouge, Shreveport, Lake Charles and New Orleans will be Water Permits 101: Understanding the Process. The session will introduce the water program's mission, major regulations that govern it, and types and examples of water permits. For Monroe and Alexandria, the topic will be Environmental Regulations 101: A Broad Overview. This session will talk about federal and state environmental regulations and what they are designed to do.
