Sewage treatment system maintenance class being offered at Nicholls State University in Thibodaux

BATON ROUGE – A sewage treatment system maintenance class is being offered at Nicholls State University in Thibodaux on Tuesday and Wednesday, Nov. 3 and 5 with sessions beginning at 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. –On Tuesday, Nov. 4, free 20 minute hands-on demonstrations begin at 2 p.m. and end at 7 p.m. (locations listed below). People with their own sewage treatment system and those interested in learning about the protection of Bayou Lafourche and the surrounding area from improperly treated sewage are encouraged to attend. The class is free and open to the general public.

Information will be provided on how to properly maintain a sewage treatment system while taking measures to avoid unsanitary conditions that could impact homes and businesses in Ascension, Assumption and Lafourche parishes.

The class is being hosted by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality and Louisiana Rural Water Association in partnership with Nicholls State University, the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals and the Barataria-Terrebonne National Estuary Program.

Citizens are encouraged to attend one of the classes listed below. Classes are an hour and a half in duration and will be held at Gouaux Hall, which is located across from the Ellender Memorial Library at the corner of Afton Drive and Madewood Drive on the Nicholls State University campus.
