



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Message From the Secretary

From my vantage point, the first half of 2004 has passed in a blur of activity punctuated with many significant events and accomplishments for our agency. It is with great pride for DEQ and our employees that I recount some of the more notable events and accomplishments thus far.

Following the change in administration, a new management team has been installed at DEQ with a minimum of disruption to the agency's ongoing activities. This gives testament to the professionalism and graciousness of the previous management and DEQ staff as well as to the abilities of our new managers.

The legislative support team has done a terrific job of getting us through the past session in good shape. The manner in which we handled our legislative matters during the session has earned the agency greater respect and credibility.

We have launched a number of significant new initiatives including: an enhanced ozone attainment program and a fight to block implementation of reformulated gas in the Baton Rouge area; an integrated mercury program, which is detailed in this issue; Jefferson Parish landfills; greater integration of headquarters and regional offices; and a new small community compliance assistance program.

DEQ has met requirements for the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and water programs so that EPA can deny the petitions to withdraw our authority for these programs. We expect to complete the requirements related

to our air program shortly.

We have enjoyed a very successful environmental conference, an enlightening "records and information management" open house, and some ice cream and laughs at Employee Recognition Day.

We have also enjoyed a number of events celebrating programmatic successes with the Environmental Leadership and the "Ready for Reuse" programs.

Of course along the way, we've had our share of challenges – some of them pretty daunting. Perhaps the most promising indication of things to come, though, is the manner in which our employees have met and overcome those challenges.

We've had a good first half of 2004 and are on track for having a very successful year. I'd like to thank all our employees for their hard work in serving the public and for protecting and improving the quality of the environment in our great state.

This fall, DEQ will celebrate 20 years of caring for Louisiana's environment. I hope you will be able to join in the planning, preparations, and an impressive schedule of events chronicling the history and achievements of our agency.

In addition, Mann utilizing graphic design students from Louisiana State University's art school, helped create a new logo that became the customized and standardized identity for the agency.


Prior to his appointment at the Department of Labor, Mann was a reporter for the Louisiana Radio Network. He was the capitol correspondent for the network in '97 and '98.

and is currently the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee for the LSU Manship School of Mass Communication.

His media relations experience coupled with his marketing background will aid the department in promoting the vast outreach activities and programs of DEQ. "We have a talented communications team in place with Rodney Mallett, Jean Kelly and Tiffany Dickerson. I want to continue the progress they have started. Eventually the opportunity to work with EPA came when Jordan reviewed wastewater analytical methods to insure compliance with their standards and guidelines. "In looking back, I was apart of several groundbreaking environmental issues."

Wilbert has served as Assistant Attorney General, Civil Litigation, for the State of Louisiana; Assistant District Attorney; Criminal Prosecution for East Baton Rouge Parish; Assistant Baton Rouge City Prosecutor/Assistant Parish Attorney; and Judge pro tempore, Baton Rouge City Court.

In his new position at DEQ, Jordan oversees four divisions, Remediation Services, Technology, Environmental Planning and Environmental Evaluation. His

goals are to maintain and enhance the environment with programs and procedures and generate new initiatives that will produce sound environmental benefits. He said he would also like to ensure continued progress as the office seeks to pursue a unified approach to remediation, simplify and clarify the scope of processes; reduce review time and labor; increase responsiveness to the public and regulated community; and more accountability.

Jordan is appreciative of the experience and professionalism of his staff and other employees within the department. "The staff displays such a technical wherewithal, they take their respective disciplines seriously and that says a lot," said Jordan. 

Louisiana joins other states across the nation to express special appreciation and gratitude to state employees for their hard work, sacrifices and unselfish spirit of dedication.





OZONE

Every Little Bit Helps



It's summer in Louisiana and that means the advent our famous square days – 90 degrees and 90 percent humidity. Ozone season runs from June to October. These hot, still days are perfect for ozone formation so DEQ is stepping up efforts to solve the problem. Even though Louisiana air quality is greatly improved, we still have one nonattainment area for ozone in the state. East Baton Rouge, West Baton Rouge, Ascension, Iberville and Livingston Parishes do not meet the air quality standard for ozone.

This year, DEQ has invested more than \$500,000 in new equipment, including 300 new canisters for air sampling, a new mobile monitoring van and other air monitoring instruments. The improved air-monitoring network incorporates 10 air-monitoring sites that measure data in 10-minute increments. DEQ will collect almost 11,000 samples of highly reactive hydrocarbons per week and take more than 534,000 samples per month. These improvements will help DEQ notify the public, industry and the media when conditions are ripe for ozone formation. With the early notification, industry plant

personnel can take a look at their processes and take the appropriate steps to reduce ozone formation. This notification system will afford those sensitive to ozone the time to take measures to protect their health.

“DEQ is taking the additional steps to protect and alert the public,” said DEQ Secretary Mike McDaniel. “The department is working with industry, the community, the media and the public in an effort to reduce the chances for ozone formation. The proactive notification approach will be a positive influence throughout the area.”

The notification system goes into effect when an air monitor registers a significant rise in ozone. When DEQ air quality experts note the increase, industry operations managers will be notified about the conditions. In addition to industry, this notification also goes out to media and the public allowing everyone to take measures in curtailing ozone-

forming activities. Citizens with sensitivity to ozone should plan their activities to avoid exposure.

With the additional monitoring, DEQ will have more comprehensive meteorological and air chemistry data that will help solve ozone problems in the future. The notification system will end in October.

DEQ's Legislative Session Recap

DEQ's executive staff was busy at this year's 2004 Legislative Session, which convened on March 29 and adjourned June 21. Listed below is a recap of approved House Bills (HB), House Resolutions (HCR, HR), Senate Bills (SB), and Senate Resolutions (SCR, SR) affecting the agency, industry, citizens and environment.

HB 130 – This new law sets the sunset date for the department (and other state departments) on July 1, 2006.

HB 377 – Provides a fee for the “safety inspection sticker” required for motor vehicles in Louisiana. The fee in most of the state is \$10. In the five-parish nonattainment area, there is an additional emission inspections required by the Clean Air Act. The additional emissions inspection fee increased from \$3 to \$8. The inspection stations will keep \$6 of the fee. DEQ will receive the remaining \$2 to operate the vehicle inspection and maintenance program.

HB 838 – Allows DEQ to receive the maximum civil penalty for a violation. In ordinary cases the amount would have been \$27,500. The new penalty amount is \$32,500 and becomes effective Aug.15.

HB 846 – The existing law provided for the department to assess a fee only on the sale of new tires in order to fund the Waste Tire Management Fund. With the new law all tire sales are subject to the fee. Captures some tires that were previously not subject to the processing fee. This bill improves accountability and addresses waste tire fund deficiencies (used and new car tires).

HCR 108 – This resolution expresses the Legislature's support for Baton Rouge's request for the maximum extension of the deadline by which the nonattainment area must switch to use of reformulated gasoline.

SB 464 – Requires that if requested, the department will hold a public hearing on the environmental assessment statement, even if no public hearing is held on the underlying permit action, but makes it clear that if a hearing is held on both the environmental assessment statement and the underlying permit, the hearings can be combined. The bill also changes the existing law in that it allows the department to hold a single public hearing in a location central to the facility if it is located in more than one parish.

SB 466 – DEQ criminal investigative personnel to carry “boot” badges signifying statewide jurisdiction and preventing unauthorized use of the badge.

SB 468 – This Act provides specific authority for the department to implement a Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan program. The Act also creates the Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund. DEQ will operate and administer the fund. Federal grant monies and appropriations from the state will capitalize the fund, although the Act does provide appropriation from the state. DEQ will be able to make loans to municipalities, other political subdivisions, eligible non-profit organizations and private parties.

SB 560 – Under the existing law, the Motor Fuel Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund contains a requirement for substantial compliance to be eligible for the fund. The new Act deletes this requirement and substitutes an extra deductible amount in its place. This insures that the sites are cleaned up while providing an incentive for owners/operators to comply with the regulations designed to prevent and detect leaks from underground storage tanks.

SCR 62 – This resolution urges the secretary of DEQ and each member of the Louisiana delegation to the United State Congress to support federal regulations mandating restriction on mercury emissions and discharges to reduce mercury contamination in the environment.

Ready for Reuse Cleans Up

■ What is Ready for Reuse?

It is a new measure of success among the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) cleanup programs. The concept was developed by EPA Region 6 in Dallas and has become a key component of EPA's National Land Revitalization Initiative.

A Ready for Reuse determination recognizes when contamination on a property has been cleaned to the extent that the property is safe based on its current or planned future use. It also provides specific information about each site, including the nature and extent of contamination, the cleanup work performed (if needed) and the status of the property with respect to state and federal requirements.

■ Why is this initiative important?

The Ready for Reuse goal is to make land revitalization and reuse a fundamental element of all EPA and state cleanup programs (e.g., RCRA, Superfund, Brownfields, tanks, voluntary cleanups, etc.) to help foster economic development and return previously contaminated or abandoned properties back into productive reuse.

■ What is DEQ's role?

DEQ began participation with the program in July 2003. The agency has made the Ready for Reuse program an integral part of its overall remediation process to achieve productive economic and environmental benefits. DEQ has committed to utilize the land use revitalization program together with the existing Brownfields and Voluntary Remediation programs to help promote redevelopment opportunities at facilities and sites throughout the state. These include operating facilities as well as facilitates that are not in full use because of concerns about RCRA requirements.

■ Which facilities have been "first" in Louisiana?

The former England Air Force Base is the first federal facility in Louisiana and one of only three air force bases in the nation to receive a Ready for Reuse determination. DEQ and EPA recognized Shell/Motiva as the first refinery in the nation to receive a determination. ExxonMobil Plastics was recognized as the first facility in Louisiana to receive a determination. ExxonMobil Refinery and Supply Division received the first Underground Storage Tank (UST) determination at the 16th annual UST/LUST conference in New Orleans.

■ England Air Force Base

DEQ and EPA issued the determination to the base during a ceremony in June at the OakWing Golf Course and Clubhouse. The portion of the base, which now houses the public 18-hole golf course, received the determination and underwent a successful investigation and risk management activities. Based on the findings, DEQ and EPA agree that environmental conditions at the course are protective of human health and the environment based on its current and anticipated future use as a commercial/industrial (non-residential) property.

England, a former United States Air Force Base, is located on approximately 2,604 acres northeast of Alexandria in Rapides Parish. The base was closed on Dec. 15, 1992. Currently, the England Economic and Industrial Development District owns and leases the base and under its administration has redeveloped and reused it. Various businesses now reside and occupy once vacated buildings. The local airport was changed from the old Esler Field in Pineville to the Airpark and renamed Alexandria International Airport. The base is now a mixed-use facility serving as the Alexandria International Airport and England Airpark. Part of the base housing was turned into a senior living community. Other redeveloped portions of the base include the Louisiana State University Medical Center at Alexandria, housing units, a daycare facility, a restaurant, a new hotel, numerous light industrial and commercial businesses and the expansion of the nine-hole

to an 18-hole golf course.

Several members of the community, elected officials and board of commissioner members attended the ceremony.

■ Shell/Motiva Norco

The facility was honored in a ceremony in May at their facility in Norco. DEQ and EPA both agree that the facility has successfully completed its investigation of the Norco East site. Both agencies have also determined that the environmental conditions at this site are protective of human health and the environment based on its current use and anticipated future use as a commercial/industrial property.

The facility where Shell and Motiva now reside in Norco has been in operation since 1918 when it was an oil terminal. Shell purchased the property in 1929 and Motiva, a joint venture between Shell and Saudi Aramco, began operating the refinery in 1998. Some of the products produced at the nearly 1,000-acre site include automotive gasoline, diesel, jet fuel, heating oil and building block chemicals such as ethylene, propylene, butadiene and chemical solvents. End products from the process range from items like packaging, bottles, food and drink containers, polyester fibers in clothes, upholstery, carpet, pillows and surgical supplies to antifreeze, paints and household detergents.

■ Where does DEQ go from here?

"Our goal is to actively promote the program and encourage other facilities across the state to participate. We have made significant accomplishments and we are extremely pleased with the hard work by all parties involved that have thus far received determinations," said Secretary Mike McDaniel. "We want to see many more firsts in Louisiana."

tion. "Sometimes all it takes is reassurance and making someone feel safe. It's a very rewarding experience and I would encourage others to join us and find out first hand," said Pam.

Pam belongs to the Baton Rouge Chapter of the Association of Government Accountants and has been Community Service Chair, Education Chair and Chapter President. This year she will serve as Regional Vice President for the south central region, overseeing six chapters in Louisiana, Arkansas, Mississippi and Alabama.

Dehron Foster may be a new face at DEQ, coming aboard in April as a mail clerk for the Office of Environmental Services. However, he is no stranger to the local theater and arts community.

Dehron began acting in 1990, and has been seen onstage in more than 30 productions in the Baton Rouge area. His interest in acting came about when he enrolled as a lark in an improvisation class at Louisiana State University. A requirement of the course called for watching a number of theater plays. The

Heisenberg left his mark in history as the infamous German nuclear physicist that tried to develop an atomic bomb during World War II.

Although, Dehron believes that acting can be time consuming and physically and emotionally draining, he has a great love for the craft. Dehron now has a new part he wants to focus his energies on. He is also an avid runner. He completed his first full marathon in February 2003. Since then, he has completed several half marathons, and plans to tackle the Walt Disney World Marathon in January. Dehron's other hobbies include reading and traveling as often as possible.

A Day in the Life of... *DEQ's New Executive Counsel*

Herman Robinson, Governor Blanco's recent appointment to the new DEQ Executive Counsel position, is looking forward to a change in duties. Since joining DEQ in 1986, he has held the positions of Staff Attorney, Administrative Law Judge (ALJ), ALJ Administrator, Assistant Secretary, and, most recently, General Counsel. As General Counsel, he found himself more an administrator for the Legal Affairs Division than a lawyer for DEQ. Robinson earned both a bachelor's and a juris doctorate from Southern University, serving seven years in the U.S. Army between degrees.

This self-described team player is a proponent of continuous improvement and life-long education, to which he attributes his successes. One result of his commitment to these ideals is a Certified Public Manager designation, which he earned in 1996. This allowed him to make effective changes, such as putting Legal

Affairs Division operations on a law-office-practice and management footing, while emphasizing teamwork and making excellence in client service a priority. Robinson explains, "As public managers, we accomplish our mission through the efforts of others. That means we have to share our philosophy and 'sell' new concepts to our colleagues, our staff, our clients, just as in the private sector."

As General Counsel, Robinson managed all operations of the Legal Affairs Division, including first or second line supervision over 15 attorneys, seven paralegals and five support staff. A large part of his time was devoted to review and approval of administrative paperwork such as budget, travel, requisitions, performance review, promotion and hiring and operations planning and evaluation. Because he was both legal counsel and administrator of the division, he was not always able to focus completely on the most enjoyable part of the job—the law and legal issues.

To improve client services, he reorganized the division into four separate sections: permits, enforcement, general law and administrative support. Each section is assigned primary areas of responsibility, generally along DEQ organizational structure, but the entire legal staff works together as a team. "Teamwork is not just a buzzword in the division, but a very real concept applied to operations and service on a daily basis," Robinson said. He pitches in as part of the team when necessary, working with other legal staff after hours or on weekends to meet commitments. "I won't ask my staff to do anything I'm not willing to do myself; I try to lead by example. I learned the value of that in the military," he said.

The division is responsible for providing legal consultation and representation to the various offices of the agency. The primary goal of the division is to provide responsive legal advice and client service, and to assist the executive staff in achieving their policy goals. "Of course we also zealously assert all claims and defenses in whatever forum DEQ finds itself litigating," said Robinson.

A typical day may start with a call from a member of the executive staff or an administrator seeking legal advice or simply passing on some development in an ongoing matter. According to Robinson, "It is important that our clients understand information needs to flow both ways. The better informed you keep your attorneys, the bet-

years ago may not be the best way today. Change is the hallmark of our times. We have to adopt new methods—walk up to change, shake hands, and embrace it," said Robinson.

ter we can serve you.” The day continues with meetings, both formal and informal, then paperwork that needs signing, correspondence to review and answer and the latest legal authorities to read. Or the legislature may be in session, with bills to track and analyze, along with preparation for testimony before committees.

Whether through environmental initiatives, case decisions, new laws or regulations, Robinson's operation is required to continually reinvent itself and reengineer the way it does business. "We constantly look for ways to improve our delivery of legal services to the agency. The way we did it 10

employees acting in their official capacities have legal questions or need legal representation," said Robinson. "We want to make the rest of the department's staff comfortable with the legal staff, to see us as approachable. 

Mercury is a naturally occurring element that is present throughout our environment. Its chemical symbol is Hg and most of us learned about it in high school chemistry. Some of us, the older ones, played with it as children, rolling it around and coating coins with it. So why is the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality concerned about it?

Mercury in the environment can take several forms. Elemental or naturally occurring mercury is found in nature as a silvery liquid or vapor. Since metallic mercury, mercury in its liquid elemental state, vaporizes into the air it presents an immediate health risk.


But mercury becomes most dangerous, and enters the food chain, when it is found in water bodies such as streams, lakes, rivers and oceans. It settles in water bottoms or sediments where it can be transformed, by bacteria

and chemical processes, to a very toxic form, methylmercury. Methylmercury, which is readily taken up into the food chain, may be found in significant levels in fish commonly caught in Louisiana waters and eaten by our citizens.

How do fish get contaminated? It happens through the food chain. Small fish eat small snails, crawfish and insects that have eaten smaller things containing mercury. Larger fish, such as largemouth bass and bowfin, eat the smaller fish and they bioaccumulate mercury.

Why is DEQ so concerned about mercury in the environment?

Mercury can present a very real health risk to our citizens, especially children under 7, pregnant and breast-feeding women and people who eat a lot of fish from an area with a mercury advisory. Inorganic and elemental mercury can cause renal toxicity, fluid in the lungs, skeletal muscle degeneration and more. Methylmercury can cause damage to the unborn and children under 7 because it is a neurotoxin and their nervous systems are still forming.



Where can you find mercury?

Mercury occurs naturally in the environment, for example in coal. It is an element and enters the air when it is burned or vaporized. Mercury reaches the ground through rain and is deposited where small organisms can ingest it and it becomes part of the food chain. Manmade mercury can be found in thermostats, dental fillings, light switches, auto switches, thermometers, fluorescent lights, batteries and appliance switches. It is found in schools, at home, in industry and hospitals.

What are we doing about mercury?

The more the public knows about mercury, its dangers and how to properly handle and dispose of it, the less of a threat it will be. So DEQ has undertaken an extensive outreach program to educate and inform the public about mercury in fish, recycling mercury and ridding our environment of man-made mercury.

In June, a series of public service announcements ran on radio stations across the state giving information about eating fish safely and recycling mercury. These announcements raised public awareness of the issues surrounding mercury contamination.

The PSAs were followed with a statewide series of workshops, presented by Chris Piehler and John Rogers, DEQ environmental scientists. The workshops included sections on mercury in the schools, mercury in hospitals and mercury management for local governments. Each section was designed to help citizens identify the location of mercury, the health effects, replacement products and the proper disposal or handling methods once mercury is found. These workshops will be available to interested parties on request.

While touring the state, presenting the workshops, Piehler and Rogers appeared on local TV programs and on radio talk shows to promote awareness and present pertinent information to the public. They have appeared on shows in Lafayette, New Orleans, Alexandria, Monroe, Shreveport, Lake Charles and Baton Rouge.

In conjunction with the Department of Health and Hospitals, DEQ conducts fish sampling and issues fish advisories for the state's waters where fish are contaminated with mercury. The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries helps designate the areas for the advisories. The advisories

are specific to a water body and indicate which fish should not be eaten and the amount of fish that can be safely eaten. The state has 36 freshwater advisories and one for the Gulf of Mexico.

DEQ continues to regulate the amount of mercury in air-emissions and water discharges through the permitting process and encourages voluntary actions by industry.


On a national level, DEQ and other state agencies are working with federal agencies to identify needs and implement long-term strategies for reducing the risk associated with mercury.

DEQ operates a mercury deposition monitoring program in concert with the National Atmospheric Deposition Program. With four monitors in the state, DEQ collects data about mercury that reaches our waterbodies from the air.

DEQ Secretary Mike McDaniel has set mercury as a priority for the department and has commissioned a workgroup to pull together the agencies efforts on mercury in all areas. This workgroup will coordinate all aspects of the mercury campaign and will provide a forum for discussion of the mercury problem within the state. Searching the EDMS Gets Faster

Searching for public records is a snap. Users of DEQ's in-house search tool, the Electronic Document Management System (EDMS), can now search even faster for documents. In the past, viewing pages in the EDMS took between eight and 25 seconds. Now, because of a recent technology upgrade, it takes less than a second to pull up any page.

EDMS allows employees and the public to search public record the agency has in its system, including permits, enforcement actions and reports. The public can search public records from a single location from the Public Records Center. They can search, retrieve, view, and print public records from the EDMS.

DEQ Assistant Records Manager Keith Sagona was charged with researching options for upgrading the former optical storage and retrieval system (OSAR) where the EDMS images are stored. He found that a new approach could improve reliability and offer faster access. The Records Management and Information Services staff partnered to implement a new magnetic storage and retrieval system (MSAR), which was brought fully on-line on March 30.

Wendy McLain, DEQ Records Manager, said, "We are happy to have found a solution that improved the EDMS user experience. Images are stored on the MSAR for quick retrieval and on the OSAR for long-term retention. We have the best of both worlds – the speed of magnetic storage and the security of optical storage."

According to Debora Reid, FileNet administrator, "There were many steps required in the process from OSAR to MSAR, including hardware and software upgrades and media migration. Coordination between both the Information Services Division and Records Management Section regarding down time, the software upgrade, and image migration kept the process from interfering with the normal operation of business at DEQ."

Feedback from EDMS users has been positive. Debbie Ford, Environ-

mental Scientist at DEQ's Southwest Regional Office, said, "With the upgrade, documents are opened quickly and paging through a document happens almost as soon as you click."

Robert Nissen, Environmental Project Specialist III, has also seen the improvement. "The upgrade to the EDMS has been quite helpful from a production stand point," he said. "Before the conversion, it would take a great deal of time to open documents, but now the response time is quite fast. I have really noticed a difference in documents with multiple pages. Since the upgrade, I can scroll through documents) without having to wait for each to load." Some of the documents are hundreds of pages long

Wave of the Future

Collaborative Effort Leads to Beach Monitoring System

The Louisiana Departments of Environmental Quality, Health and Hospitals, Office of State Parks and the Lake Pontchartrain Basin Foundation launched Louisiana's first collaborative coastal recreational beach monitoring program.

A press conference to announce the formation of the Louisiana Coastal Beach Monitoring Program was held on Monday, May 10, at the Grand Pavilion of Fontainebleau State Park on Lake Pontchartrain. At the event, representatives from the state agencies and the LPBF discussed the pilot monitoring program and unveiled new signs that notify people about swimming and the water's quality.

DEQ, DHH and OSP worked together to launch the three-beach pilot program that will later expand to other public beaches. Louisiana is responding to the Environmental Protection Agency's Beaches Environmental Assessment and Coastal Health Act of 2000. The BEACH Act directs EPA to assist states in developing appropriate water quality standards and provides funds for coastal beach monitoring programs. EPA is working closely with Louisiana to meet the requirements of the BEACH Act.

Through a grant from the EPA, DHH is developing a monitoring program that determines the water quality of coastal recreational beach waters and whether it is safe to swimmers. A notification system that will give citizens up-to-date information about water quality is also being developed. DEQ and DHH will use information from the pilot studies to develop water quality standards to protect Louisiana's coastal recreation waters.

Water quality is based on naturally occurring or manmade pollutants in coastal recreational waters. Samples are taken and tests are then conducted to measure the number of pathogens and pathogen indicators. When the established water quality standards are exceeded, public notification is made.

"This is an example of state agencies working together, and with other organizations, in an effort to improve vital interests of the state," DEQ Secretary Mike McDaniel said. "By working together we can make this state better for the people who live here and more attractive to those who want to relocate here."

The water-monitoring program will begin at Louisiana state parks — Fontainebleau, Grand Isle and Cypremort Point.


Dr. Fred Cerise, secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals said the program is a result of state agencies working together.

"We have been challenged by Gov. Blanco to tear down the walls that separate state agencies in order to improve services to citizens," Dr. Cerise said. "The Office of State Parks and the Department of Health and Hospitals will work with local governments to put this notification system in place."
