#### Hello Community Leaders, Planners, Real Estate Developers & Professionals, and Environmental Consultants!

Does your community have an abandoned building, old gas station or other potentially contaminated property that is impeding future economic growth? Are you looking for resources to address environmental concerns preventing the redevelopment of key properties in your community to foster revitalization of your neighborhoods? If so, you are cordially invited to a <u>free Brownfields Resources workshop</u> co-hosted by the City of Shreveport, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, Louisiana Brownfields Association, and the Technical Assistance to Brownfields Program (TAB) at Kansas State University. The two-day workshop will run from 9:30am – 4:30pm on Tuesday, June 11<sup>th</sup> with lunch provided; and 9:30am - 1:00 pm on Wednesday, June 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Day 1** will provide an overview of Brownfield Resources to help address environmental issues at vacant and abandoned properties to facilitate their redevelopment. We'll also provide tips and ideas for accessing Brownfield grants, building your Brownfields Network, and thinking creatively about Brownfield sites. **Day 2** will go in depth on putting together a Brownfield Team to successfully manage a Brownfield Program and apply for Brownfield funding.
