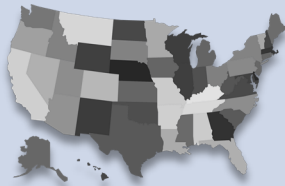
Serving Small Businesses and the Environment

- Advisory panel

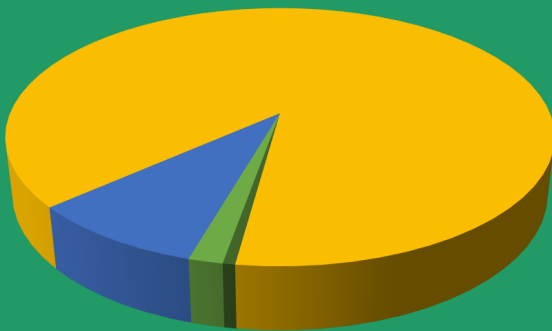

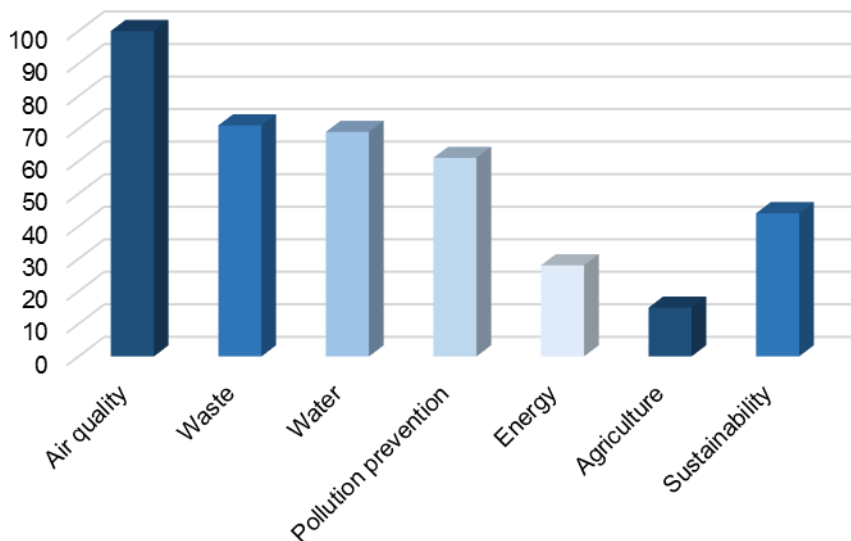

How we make an impact

Small Business Environmental Assistance Programs throughout the country offer compliance assistance in many areas. All programs provide assistance with air quality, but several also offer additional services such as hazardous waste and pollution prevention technical assistance. These “multi-media” programs are a “one-stop-shop” for small businesses with limited resources. The chart below represents the percentage of programs providing compliance assistance in the following areas.

Case study: The success of Minuteman Press

Minuteman Press, a small Kansas printer, has worked with their SBEAP program for a number of years. As part of their efforts to go beyond compliance, they changed from petroleum-based ink to all soy-or vegetable-based ink and pressroom cleaners. This change resulted in reductions of VOC emissions by 22 percent and HAP emissions by 93 percent. Minuteman Press conducts waste audits annually and recycles more than 83 percent of the waste. Minuteman Press is a Sustainable Green Printer and won a National SBEAP award in 2012.
